ABSTRACT

The Social Effects of the Atomic Explosion in John Hersey's Hiroshima; Irma Windasari; 030110101020; 2007; 61 pages; English Department, Faculty of Letters, Jember University.

Atomic bomb explosion in Hiroshima is one of the events happened in the World War II, the most destructive war in human history. The atomic bomb explosion results in some social effects toward the citizens in Hiroshima. It is written in the novel, *Hiroshima*. This thesis tries to discuss the social effects of the atomic bomb explosion through the novel. This thesis tries to explain the social transition before and after the explosion. The transition of the education system, economic, health, nationalism and the change of the social class happened in *Hiroshima's* society. It will give the explanation about the social effects that result in some problems in some aspects of life.
