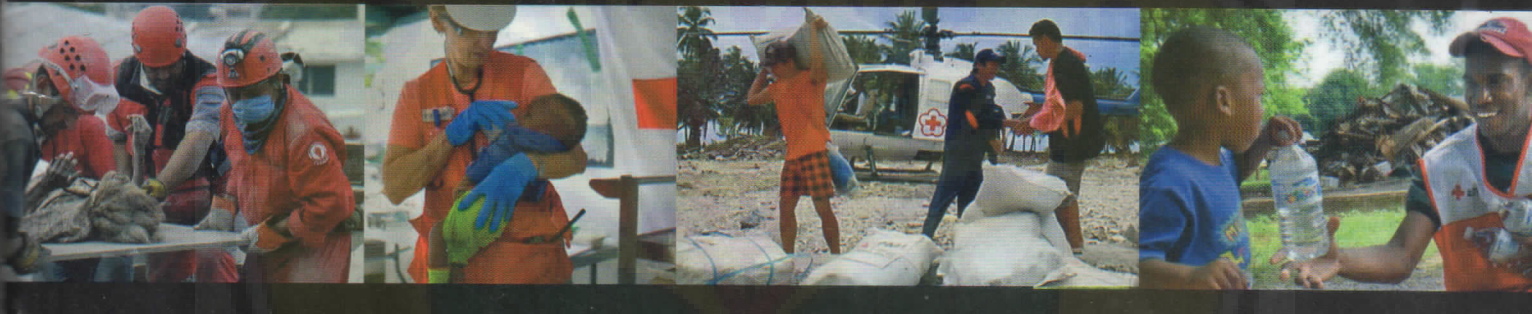

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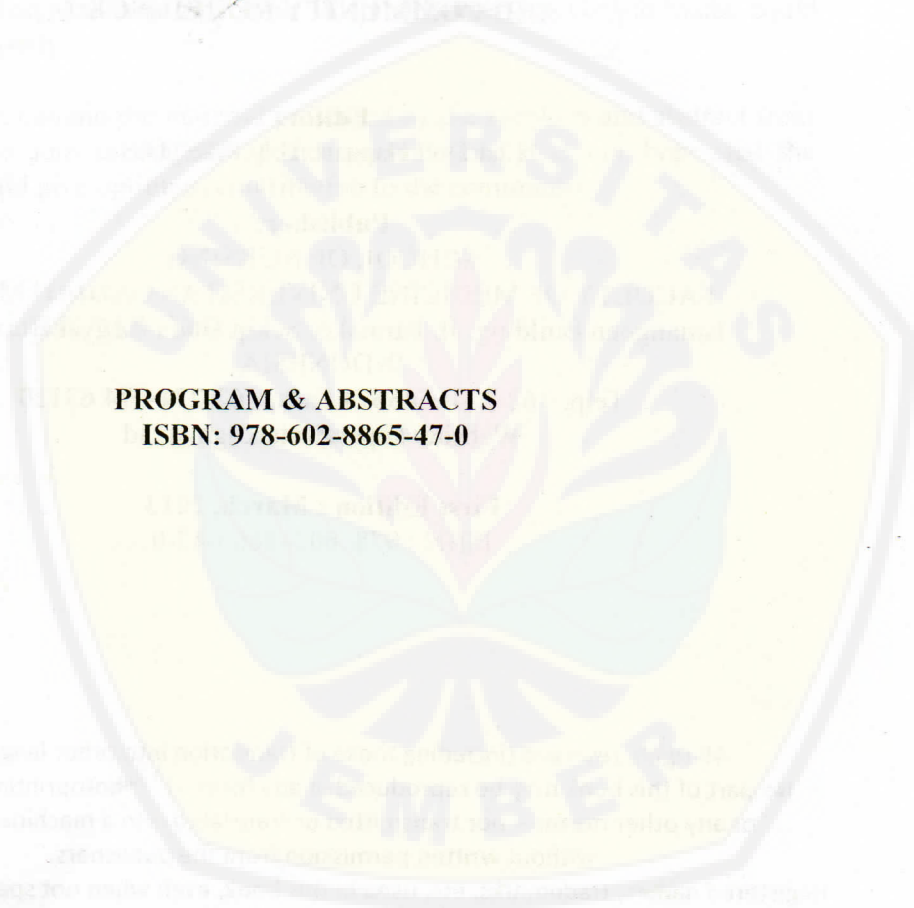

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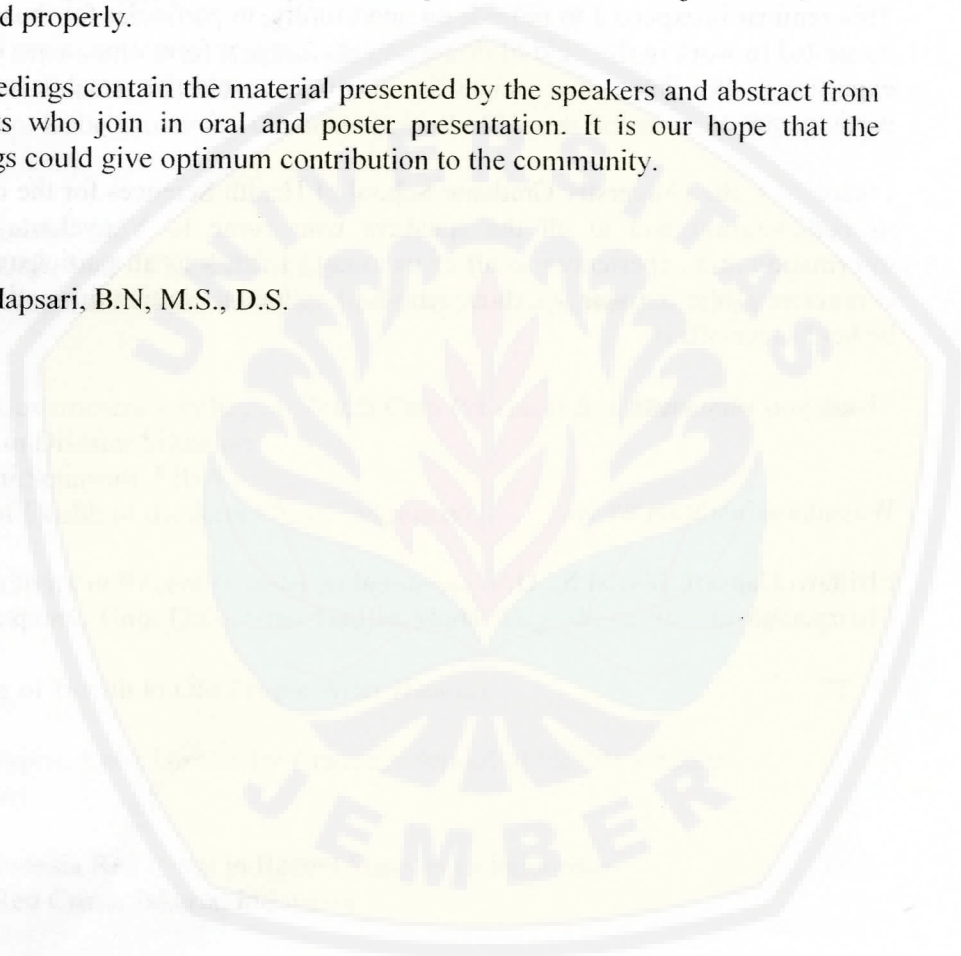
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FOREWORD

Aim: this study will be identified health education with role play method for student behavior the effort overstroming in community. **Method:** these research used to quasi experimental research with pre and post test. Samples that used 44 student with graded 4 and 5 in State Elementary School of Panti 1. Technique sampling with simple random sampling. These research conducted for month of February-March 2012. **Result:** training with health education through role play have influenced the students behavior for participation in overstroming prevention program (p 0.01). **Conclusion:** the students are involved for prevention program in community like having overgreen areas, so they can have a positive thinking about health of environment.
