The Chronicles of Narnia: The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe (1950) one of the seven popular fantasy novels for children written by C. S Lewis. It is a story about the adventures of the Pevensies in Narnia. They discover that Narnia is in bondage. It is captivated for a hundred years under the spell of the evil White Witch.
