

LAPORAN KASUS EKSTRAKSI GIANT POLIP ANTROKOANAL

Abstract

Antrochoanal polyp is a benign lesion that originate from the mucosa of the maxillary sinus and then evolved into the meatus medius and extends to choanal and nasopharynx. The incidence of antrochoanal polyp is about 4-6 % of all nasal polyps. Antrochoanal polyp is a type of nasal polyp that most found in children and young age. This paper reports the case of giant antrochoanal polyp in female patient aged 17 years whom performed polyp extraction. Extraction was performed with polyp string and Bakesley forcep through the nasal cavity and choanal plier through the oropharynx. The polyps tissue was extracted in toto with a length of 20 cm and weight of 60 grams. Evaluation on the seventh day and third month postoperative that was no recurrence.
